

DECLARATION

concerning Regulation (EU) No 995/2010 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 20 October 2010 laying down the obligations of operators who place timber and timber products on the market

Hereby we would like to declare that the company Kronopol Sp. z o.o. meets the requirements of above mentioned regulation.

1) Country of harvest

100% of the timber is harvested in European Union: 95% in Poland, 5% in Germany and Lithuania.

2) Sub-national region

Poland: Regionals Directorates of State Forests in Zielona Góra, Poznań, Katowice, Szczecin, Łódź, Piła and Wrocław.
Germany: Saxony and Brandenburg.
Lithuania: the whole country.
